How Open Source helped me

- I was working on cool stuff, but no one outside the company could see it
- I was feeling ready to do more
- I dreamed about working
 - Fully remote
 - With a diverse team
 - With great professionals that would make me grow
 - Communicating in english
 - Doing something that many people around the world would use
 - A company like Red Hat
 - Important in the Java ecosystem
 - Several people that I admire works at Red Hat

How can I work in a company like Red Hat if no one knows me?

Red Hat is the biggest open source company in the world

That's the answer!

OPEN SOURCE

I decided to become an open source contributor

- I wanted to contribute to Quarkus
- I read the contributors guide
- I downloaded the code
- I looked for an issue that I could fix, but it was pretty hard
- Then I found the “good first issue” label
- These issues were much simpler than the other ones and I could find one that I thought I could fix

Trying to fix the first issue

- I had no idea which part of the code I needed to change. I studied the code, but couldn't find
- I left a message in the issue and one of the maintainers answered
- I spent several days understanding the code, debugging and trying to fix
- Then I fixed and submitted a PR
- It was reviewed and I had to change a couple of things
- Then it was merged
- I was officially a Quarkus contributor

Then I kept going

- Fix more issues
- Contribute to other projects
- Contribute to specifications
- Started a blog
- Gave my first talk

Several opportunities appeared
Until that one that I dreamed about

The opportunity to work full time as an
open source contributor at Red Hat

Red Hat could be sure about my skills
because of my open contributions

What would I do today if I had to start all over again?
How can you start?

How to start

- Start small
- Make it easy for contributors to accept your contribution
- Remember: They don't know you
- They have more important things to do than review a huge PR from someone they know nothing about

How to start



Know the community

- Join mailing list
- Join IM channels



Get known

- Report bugs
- Answer questions
- Ask questions
- Be helpful



Build trust

- Do the dirty job
- When the maintainers need someone they'll remember you



Documentation

Documentation is usually outdated. It's common to find broken links or typos. Use an IDE or a plugin that identifies these kind of errors

Tests

Add more tests. Improve test coverage. Review the existing ones

Warnings

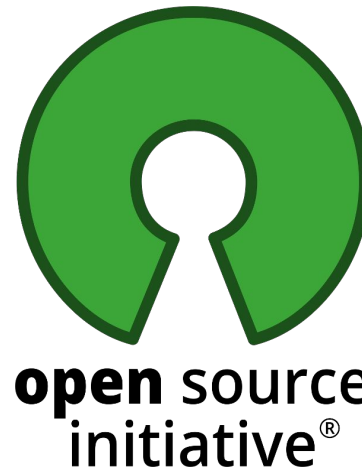
Fix warnings of a class or a couple of classes that are related.

Fix an issue

You'll usually find issues on

- GitHub issues
 - Jira Issue Tracker
 - Bugzilla
- Look for low priority issues
 - You can take your time to fix them
 - On GitHub, look for issues labeled as “good first issue”
 - Ask if you can work on that issue
